Pastor's Ponderings

Growing In God

Spring brings new life. Easter occurs in spring as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection to life eternal. In spring, nature grows. We too are called to grow. Our spiritual growth is for all seasons.

In Isaiah 58:11 we read, "You shall be like a watered garden." That's a magnificent image of how God's love inspires beauty to grow in us. God wants us to imagine ourselves spiritually as a flower garden. Through Jesus Christ we blossom into all God created us to become.

Have you ever imagined God as a Master Gardener? We are the seeds. God is the Gardener. God knows exactly how we can best grow. Since there are only two ushers named for each Sunday, the greeters need to help with passing the offering plates. We appreciate your willingness to participate in the service.

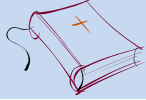

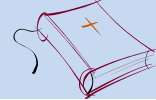

News from Session

News from our Treasurer: We have very good news to share about some recent financial activities. A number of years ago, a portion of the mineral rights to a property in West Virginia were donated to the church. Several new wells just came into production. On February 9th, we were blessed to receive the proceeds from April-November 2016 in the amount of \$157,343.34. On February 23rd, we were blessed to receive \$15,332.43, and on March 29th we were again blessed to receive \$21,651.62 – equaling a total of \$194,327.39. At this time, we are not aware of how long the church will continue to receive these proceeds. As good stewards of this wonderful windfall, we want to keep in mind that the church will need to pay real estate taxes, which we have continued to do since the church received this donation. The money is currently being invested in a separate designated account under the counsel of the Investment Committee. The money is not allocated for anything special within this segregated account – there will be an opportunity in the future for the church to discern the appropriate allocation of this money. We are truly blessed. We are especially thankful to our Trustees and particularly Peter Martens whose leadership has been most helpful, and to Gary Montgomery and all those who took the initiative over the years to handle this property. We will keep you updated.

Electronic statements: With the computer input of our giving, the church is posed to send statements electronically by email – this will help decrease our spending for postage. The church office will continue to maintain manual record-keeping simultaneous with the computer record-

keeping, so you may still request manual statements. The church office has emailed those with known email addresses to ask if you would like your statement emailed – we have had a number responded positively. If you have not seen the email from the church office and would like to receive your statements through email, please contact Linda Bracht at firstprespy211@yahoo.com

News from the Presbyterian Women

Blanket and Tool Sundays: Each year the Presbyterian Women collect donations for the Church World Services “Blankets and Tools Program” around Mother's Day. This year we will have the collection at church on Sundays April 30th and May 7th. A card and envelope to honor either a mother or father will be given for each \$5 donation. This amount, \$5, supports the cost of a blanket or a tool which can be given to help someone in need. The churchworldservice.org web site reports some of the many places blankets, tools, health kits and other supplies are needed. The U.S., Syria, Serbia, and numerous countries in Africa are just a few of the locations where supplies are sent. Your gifts transform the lives of mothers, fathers, and children struggling to build a better life. And we get transformed in the process...hearts get bigger, lives are richer, and we are more connected to our world.

Chicken BBQ: Thank you to all who made brownies, bought dinners and helped with the Presbyterian Women's annual chicken BBQ on Saturday, April 29th. The Presbyterian Women made \$801 from the sell of the chicken, and then another \$106 in donations for a total of \$907.

Miracle Cloths: The Presbyterian Women are selling streak-free microfiber Miracle Cloths as a fundraiser – \$5.00 for each cloth. The cloth fiber is a special yarn that is strong and is virtually lint-free - it does not damage any surface. The fibers grab and hold dirt, dust and grime - tough on dirt and gentle on surface - these cloths are GREAT for cleaning windows and almost anything else. Please see Sandy Carlson.

News from the Outreach

Alternative Spring Break: Outreach is supporting the spiritual and religious development of Keuka College students by making a gift to support the Alternative Spring Break trip to Costa Rica. This is an opportunity for the students to learn about other cultures and themselves, to develop leadership skills and to grow spiritually, as they wrestle with injustices they see. In the past, in Costa Rica, they have taught English, sang songs, played soccer, dodge ball, volleyball and basketball with boys (ages 8-18) in an orphanage; painted a house and a school; attended a recovery meeting; drank freshly harvested coconut ‘milk’ with the men at a farm for drug addiction rehabilitation; visited with senior citizens in a retirement community; attended worship service in Spanish, zip-lined through the forest canopy and swam in the hot springs. Alternative Spring Break reinforces the values of service and social responsibility. By interacting with the people of Costa Rica, spending time with two incredible missionaries – Ralph and Mary (Curtis) Miller, Penn Yan Academy and Keuka College graduate, and also with one another, students’ lives are changed.

One Great Hour of Sharing: Thank you so much to everyone who donated to One Great Hour of Sharing – our wonderful church donated \$632 to serve people in our community and around the world by alleviating hunger, rebuilding after crises or catastrophe, and working with communities to overcome oppression.

The youth will be participating jointly with Kirkwood Presbyterian Church on a summer mission trip again in 2017. This year we will be staying local and working with Camp Whitman. Camp Director Lea Kone has agreed to add a second "mission camp" week July 16-21 to accommodate the schedule of our group. We will be working with her to find projects in Penn Yan, Dundee, and surrounding areas that the group can tackle. Youth will be doing fundraising in coming months to help underwrite camp cost (\$175/youth) and to purchase some of the supplies needed

for the projects. It is especially exciting that we will be able to help members of our extended community this year. We also look forward to sharing the beauty of our region with the volunteers from Virginia. More details will be shared as we finalize all of our plans.

Sunday Hospitality

Helping With Hospitality

Sunday morning is for many the core of our congregational life, a special time of the week when we gather to reflect and contemplate, celebrate, and revere life's mysteries and things of ultimate concerns. During this time we are spending with each other and getting involved in each other's lives, deep fellowship is experienced. The relationships are the glue that hold the church together.

Sustaining each service is a group of volunteers who perform hospitality duties to make the service comfortable and pleasing for our congregation.

Many hands make light work. Everyone is encouraged to participate. As a congregation we all share the responsibility of welcoming each other and hosting our guests. Newcomers are also invited to participate. Helping with hospitality is a great way to get to know other newcomers and longtime members and feel more a part of the church family.

Each week it takes about seven volunteers and two additional volunteers are needed monthly to support our Sunday Service. When everyone volunteers a few times during the church year, every task can be comfortably covered.

Ushers (2) - Each Sunday one usher welcomes people at the church entrance; one distributes bulletins in the aisle. Ushers help collect offerings, light candles, restock pew racks, ring church bell, manage microphone during announcements and joys/concerns, etc.

Greeters (2) - Greeters welcome people as they enter the sanctuary, encourage people to wear name tags, help with collection of offering, host Coffee Hour and chooses to make it as simple or as complex as wants (the quality of fellowship is more important than quality of the food).

Nursery - Volunteer provides adult supervision in the nursery after the Youth Message until church is over. The sermon can be heard in the nursery.

Lay Reader - Volunteer reads the Scriptures assigned by the pastor at the podium.

Communion Server - Volunteer helps serve Communion, usually the first Sunday of the month.

Birthday Cake Maker - Volunteer provides cake/cupcakes for the Coffee Hour the second Sunday of the month.

How Do I Sign Up?

The easiest way to sign-up to volunteer as a Greeter, Usher, Lay Reader, helper in the nursery, server of Communion, birthday cake baker, etc. is to sign your name in a blank space on the scheduling sheet that is posted on the bulletin board in the foyer. A complete list of duties for each task is also posted there. If you have not yet had the opportunity to volunteer at one of these tasks, feel free to ask for a coach.

It is suggested that each person volunteer for greeter and usher two times per year, once during January - June and once each July - December.

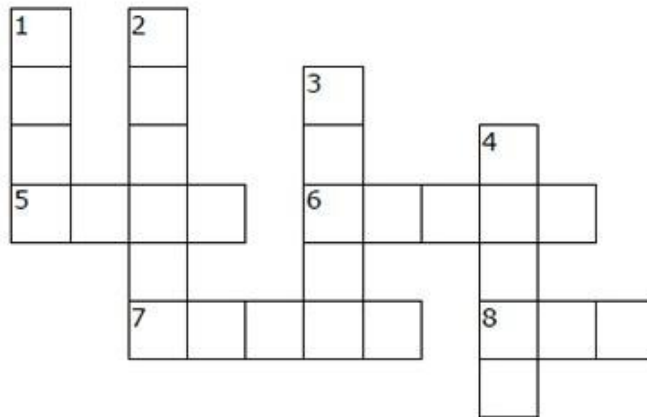
